Our library opened its doors to the public in June 1952 in the building opened in the former Village Hall, now the Northbrook Civic Foundation building. The original collection consisted of several hundred gift books and a loan of 4,000 volumes from the Illinois State Library. Today, we have about 250,000 materials for you to browse and enjoy! 
